
Declaration of consent for data processing by Veritas

As part of my international travel, I (the “customer”) have decided to undergo COVID 19 testing by Veritas Genetics, Inc., a Delaware corporation (hereinafter: “**the responsible person**”). In the course of the testing, personal data will be collected and processed in accordance with the relevant data protection regulations.

Having said this,

I declare my consent to the processing of my personal data

in accordance with the following provisions:

1. Type of data used

1.1 For the service ordered by the customer, the following personal data may or will be processed:

- 1.1.1 First and last name;
- 1.1.2 Gender;
- 1.1.3 Nationality;
- 1.1.4 Date of birth;
- 1.1.5 Address;
- 1.1.6 Telephone number / mobile number;
- 1.1.7 E-mail address;
- 1.1.8 Medical report;
- 1.1.9 Type of sample material;
- 1.1.10 Test result.

2. Person responsible for data collection

2.1 Veritas is solely responsible for the Data collection and the compliance with its obligations as data processor within the meaning of the European General Data Protection Regulation („**GDPR**“; *Datenschutz-Grundverordnung*).

- 2.2 If Veritas uses the services of another laboratory service provider in accordance with section 3 of this declaration, Veritas shall remain exclusively responsible. The transfer shall take place exclusively within the framework of order processing.

3. Purpose of data processing and data forwarding

- 3.1 The data mentioned under section 1 will be used for the performance of the laboratory medical examination ordered by the customer for the detection of a Sars-CoV-2 infection.
- 3.2 Data are forwarded to external laboratory service providers as part of laboratory medical testing for Sars-CoV-2 infection.
- 3.3 Under certain circumstances, the local laboratory responsible for testing in the country of destination may be obliged to forward the test result to the local competent authority in accordance with the local infection protection regulations, in particular on the basis of the Infection Protection Act (*Infektionsschutzgesetz*) and the legal ordinances (*Rechtsverordnungen*) issued.
- 3.4 The customer's data will be deleted in accordance with the legal requirements.

4. Legal basis of processing

- 4.1 The processing of the data mentioned under No. 1 is based on the consent given by the customer. In this case, the legal basis for the processing is art. 6 para. 1 sent. 1 lit. a. GDPR.
- 4.2 In addition, the processing is also indispensable for the performance of the service commissioned by the customer. In this respect, the processing is also based on art. 6 para. 2 sentence 1 lit. b. GDPR.
- 4.3 As far as the processing of a special category of personal data is concerned, the processing is governed by art. 9 para. 1 lit. a. GDPR.

5. Right of withdrawal and other rights

- 5.1 The undersigned has the right to revoke this consent at any time with effect for the future without stating a reason. An e-mail to [_____ -Insert Veritas info or customer service email address] is sufficient for this purpose. The lawfulness of the processing carried out on the basis of the consent until the revocation is not affected by the revocation.
- 5.2 According to art. 15 GDPR, the undersigned has the right to request information from the responsible person as to whether and, if so, to what extent personal data is being provided.

6. Consequences of refusal of consent

Consent to data processing is in principle voluntary. However, the signatory is aware of the fact that if he/she refuses to give his/her consent, it will not be possible to execute the contract. It will then not be possible for Veritas to carry out a Sars-Cov-2 detection procedure.
